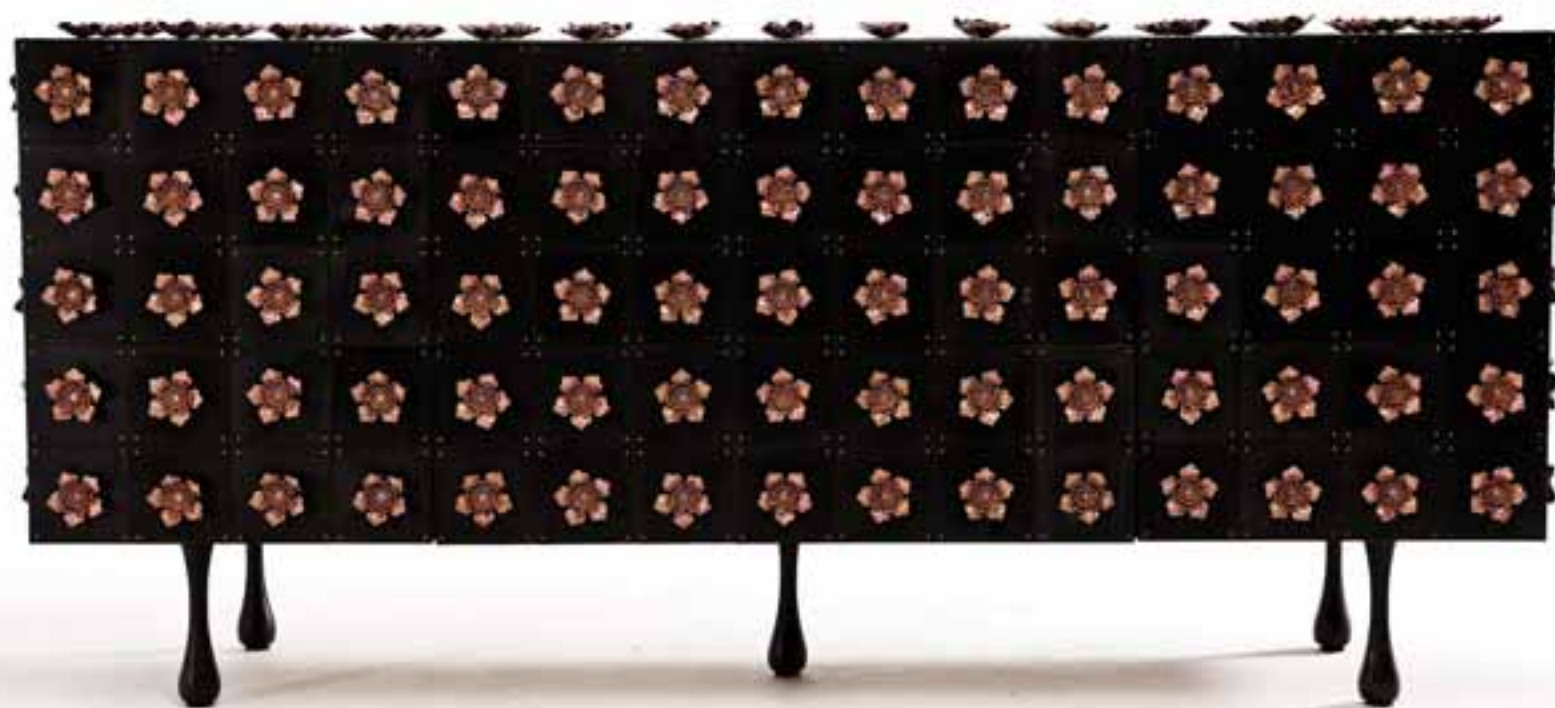

The installation tells the time digitally using the hands of 288 analogue clocks, which spin into place to form the numbers. The piece can also be programmed to bespoke designs.

Why we love it: Emirati designer, Aljoud Lootah, created Unfolding Unity as part of the Design Road Professional initiative that aims to foster Middle Eastern design talent. The programme saw four Emirati designers develop projects from concept, and is a key step in establishing a local contemporary design scene in Dubai. The stool takes its starting point from simplicity and symmetry in production and, when viewed from above, forms a classic Arabesque motif.

Why we love it: The Majlis Gallery was the first art gallery to open its doors in Dubai in 1989. To celebrate their inaugural participation in Design Days Dubai, the gallery presented an ethereal installation by New Zealand ceramicist, Peter Collis. The collection of crackle-glazed vessels, stunning in their simplicity, were accompanied by a series of ceramic bowls by Collis with 'hidden' poetry inscribed in their surfaces that could only be read in a certain light.

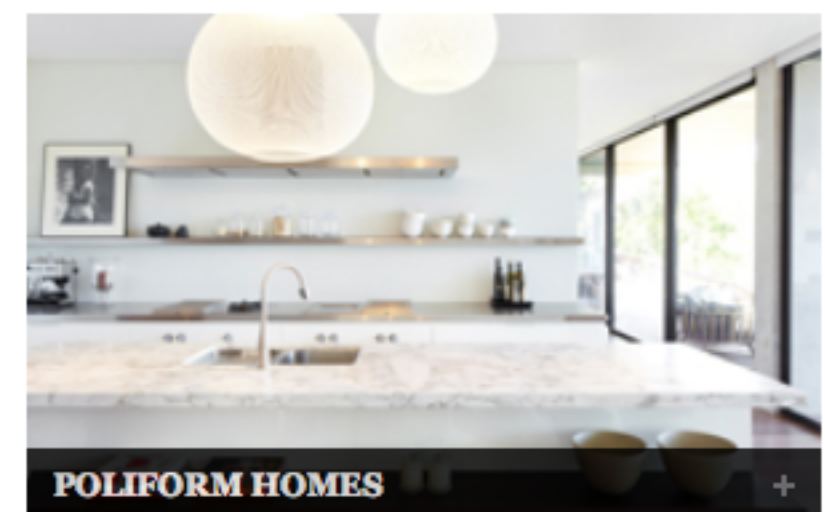

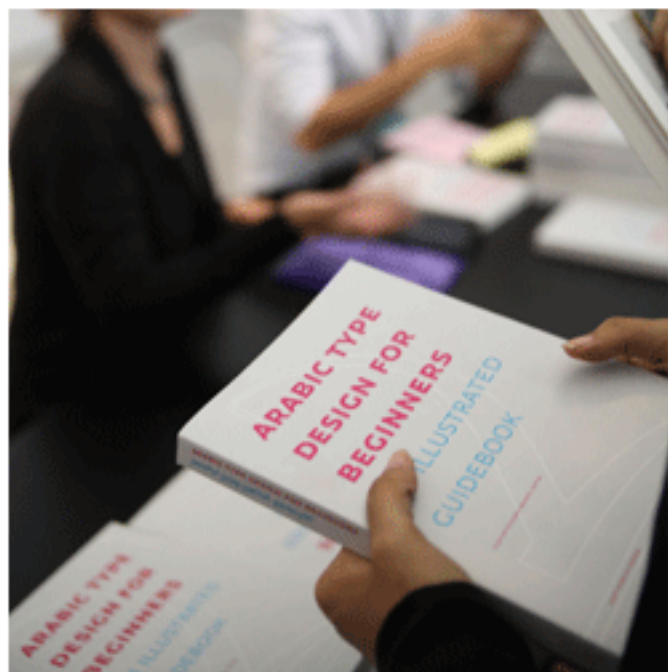
