Dubai Meets Tokyo

Dubai and Tokyo may share a continent but our worlds are poles apart, little comparison of the two are noted, Dubai is ornate, bejeweled, loud and shiny, Tokyo by contrast is colossal, with it's clean lines, quiet words and sterile environments, but for the first time we now have a connection.

This year Dubai made its debut at the Tokyo Designers Week Exhibition. A joint effort of Brownbook magazine and His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum, the Prime Minister of the UAE and ruler of Dubai's business endeavor Falcon & associates. Japan's annual event aims to give a platform to upcoming designers, authors and leaders in the creative industries. As part of the debut show, Dubai Futures featured a showcase of furniture pieces by Khalid Shafar. The event was also supported by a discussion on Creative Culture, a showcase of Brownbooks 'Guide to Dubai' translated into Japanese, as well as the second installment of The Gold Ring. This manga-inspired comic series following the adventures of an Emirati boy called Sultan, who enters a falconry competition called the Gold Ring. Created by Qais Sedki, an Emirati author and illustrated by Akira Himekawa – a duo of female Japanese comic book artists this was truly a Creative Culture connection

The exhibition was held in a variety of venues across the region including the Tsutaya book and record store in the suburban centre of Roppongi Hills and Selan, an ultra modern restaurant located close to Meiji-Jingu-Gaien Park

Dubai Futures London took place in July 2011 in collaboration with Falcon Associates and the London Mayor's Shubbak Festival. You can view the video below.
